Dear Coach:

The following is important information about the **Iolani Invitational Dual Meet Wrestling Tournament**. Please read carefully and contact me if you have any questions or concerns.

Format:

- During the first day, the tournament format divides the teams into pools of up to five teams each. These pools will hold a round robin competition of three to four duals each. The placement of the teams within their pools is decided upon at the coaches' meeting at the first day of the tournament. Mainland teams, teams from the same league, and teams of strength will be separated from each other for the first day's competition as much as possible.
- During the second day, the top two teams from each pool will be seeded in two championship pools. These pools will hold a round robin competition. The winners of each of the championship pools will meet for the tournament championship. The runners-up of each pool will meet for third place. The third place finishers of each pool will meet for fifth place. The teams that finish third or lower during the first day's competition will be placed in a single elimination, bracketed, consolation tournament.
- Every team is guaranteed a minimum of four dual meets with a maximum of eight dual meets. No team will wrestle more than five dual meets in one day.

In the Event of a Tie:

If there is a tie in the pool competition, the following tie-breaker criteria will be used:

1. Fewest number of unsportsmanlike or flagrant violations.
2. Winner of the head to head dual meet.
3. Greatest number of team points accumulated in pool competition.
4. Greatest number of falls accumulated in pool competition (including technical falls).
5. Greatest number of wins accumulated in pool competition.

If there is a tie in the score of a dual meet in the championship bracket the NFHS criteria will be used.

Number of Wrestlers: Teams may enter as many individual wrestlers as they desire. It is a good plan to enter multiple wrestlers as the competition can become a battle of endurance. Teams may also place their extra wrestlers on teams which are short of filling the weight classes. The priority for filling these teams will be from the teams from the mainland. Wrestlers in this situation can not score team points.

Weight classes: Weight classes are those of the National Federation; 103, 112, 119, 125, 130, 135, 140, 145, 152, 160, 171, 215, and 285 plus a one pound allowance (for all that Christmas turkey). There will be no second day weigh in.

Entry Fees: Entry fees are due. If you have not turned in your entry form and entry fee, please do so ASAP or contact me. Please remember to contact me if you have any questions or concerns.

Directions to Iolani School: From Honolulu International Airport (HNL):

1. Exit the airport onto H-1 heading east or towards Diamond Head
2. You will pass a number of off-ramps, including the Likelike highway, the Pali Highway, Punchbowl Street, Vinyard, etc.
3. Immediately after you pass the Punahou off ramp, move to the right hand lane.
4. Exit onto Bingham Street. It is a frontage road that parallels the freeway.
5. Turn right on Isenberg
6. Follow Isenberg to the third light.
7. Turn left onto Date Street
8. Follow Date to the second light, stay in the right-hand lane.
9. At the second light you will be at the multiple-street intersection of Kapiolani, Kamoku and Date.
10. Do not take the hard right onto Kapiolani. Take the less acute right, across Kapiolani, onto Kamoku Street
11. Iolani School is about one block in on the left. Enter the parking structure on the left and park on floor two or higher.
